### Portable Radios Available For OTHG-PHX Members

We now have a "contact" for purchasing a portable radio for use on our traveling trips. If you have been on any of our car cruises/trips, the radios we use from car to car, are now available through "John, the radio man" from Northern Electronics. John was able to have our radio fixed and also the radio of the Du Bois'. We had purchased these radios back in 2001 for \$320 + from a supplier that is out of business now.

John is able to supply us with the new Vertex UHF Portable Radio which is light weight and compact size. It is a little smaller than what some of us have now.

It is rugged construction, loud, clear audio output, 12.5/25 kHz bandwidth, etc. It is the VX-160 Series. The VX160U package deal includes the radio, charger,

everything, a three year warranty at \$245.52 plus tax, and is purchased through a state contract number. This unit is compatible with our current radios that some of us now have. He highly recommends the UHF radio. He said these are especially durable and are used by the school bus drivers and other state agencies. John can also get a VHF radio, the VX160V pkg at \$231.84 plus tax.
