Next I found a neat little Red 33 Dodge coupe for sale in Scottsdale so I bought that. Having both the 48 Plymouth and the 33 Dodge I was car poor.

I then sold the 48 to fellow club member Bob Bailey.

We had some tough luck with the 33 Dodge, smashed up the front end twice, (long story) and after last rebuild swapped it for a red yellow/flamed 1937 Chevy sedan (worse trade I ever made).

After bringing the 37 up to a dependable driver, I got the itch for something different. A fellow at the Williams car show made me an offer, and I sold the 37.

Found a Yellow 33 Ford 3 window in California so we bought that. Liked the 33 but it was my first glass car and I wasn't sure about it, traded it for a nicely done Black 48 Plymouth coupe from Eastern Texas.

The 48 was a very nice car, but I still wanted to have a hotrod. Actually Brenda says I always want the car that I don't have, guess that pretty true.

The 48 went in a trade for a unique 31 Ford hi-boy Woodie with 33 front clip. Fun little car but difficult to travel in and the hot Phoenix garage was telling on the wood work.

Swapped it to a guy in Galveston for a Silver 51 Chevy sedan, nice driver but the "feeling" didn't last long with it. I traded it for a very nice 31 hi-boy sedan from Wyoming.

A great little car but also difficult to travel in with no trunk and a small back seat.

That went for a 1955 bright yellow Ford f-100 out of California. Lots of high dollar pieces on that truck. Uncomfortable on the highway, problematic air ride system.

Finally got the leaks in the air ride corrected, and traded that for a chopped 32 Ford sedan from Ohio. After awhile and a few long trips, The 32

Sedan went for a 1938 Dodge coupe from Prescott, but built in San Bernardino and we still have and enjoy that ride.
