For those of you who have never

experienced a Chinese Auction, we donate baskets with a theme (Coffee, Books, Car items, Travel, a dinner theme, Candles, Mystery, etc.). The show participants buy tickets on the baskets and put a ticket in the can in front of the basket they are hoping to win. At a specified time, all ticket sales STOP. No more tickets are sold after that time.

A ticket is drawn from each can and posted on a white board. The participant must check the board themselves. No announcements are made. If they have a winning ticket, they get that basket or item. After 10 minutes, if any basket(s) are left, we draw another ticket. We, the members, donate the baskets, but we cannot win them ourselves. Only the show participants are eligible to buy tickets. All items in the baskets must be new. You may do a basket yourself, or have two or three of you, do one together.
