Car Talk - from Steve Bryant

Needing to change your car's oil every 3000 miles is a myth. Many cars today can go longer without affecting engine wear. Automakers are recommending oil changes at 5000, 7000 or even 10,000 miles based on driving conditions.

What others are saying about the 3000 mile myth:

"Conventional wisdom has held that the oil should be changed about every 3000 miles. This notion has been ingrained into peoples' heads for decades, in part as a marketing ploy by oil companies. The 3000 mile interval made sense when engines used single-grade non-detergent oils. But with the latest oils and car designs, it's no longer necessary to change oil that often under normal driving conditions."

Chemical & Engineering News

"Most manufacturers now recommend changing the oil every 7500 miles. We recommend doing it every 5000 miles, because we tend to be more cautious about protecting the engine. Very few people recommend changing the oil every 3000 miles anymore, it's just not necessary, and the environmental cost is too high."

NPR's Car Talk

"Ford Motor Company generally recommends getting an oil change every 5000 miles or every 6 months, whichever comes first."

"Synthetic oils, because of their better properties, need to be changed less often, at intervals up to 25,000 miles or more. In the end, the best advise on the type of oil to use and frequency of oil changes is to follow the manufacturer's recommendation in your cars owner's manual."

"Most major automakers agree: the adage that

you should change your car's oil every 3000 miles is outdated, and even 5000 miles may be too often."

"Although oil companies and quick-lube shops like to promote this idea (that engine oil should be changed every 3000 miles) it's usually not necessary. Go by the recommended oil change schedule in your vehicle's owner's manual. Most vehicles driven under normal conditions can go 7500 miles or more between oil changes. Some models now come with a monitoring system that alerts the driver when the oil needs changing. Depending on driving conditions, these can extend change intervals to 10,000 or 15,000 miles."

Consumer Reports

"I remember getting my first car and how my father kept telling me how important it was to change the oil every 3000 miles. a lot has changed since then. Today's oil is much better and it can last alot longer. Here's what to do: Check your owner's manual and follow the manufacturer's recommendations."

MSNBC Consumer Man

"Conventional wisdom holds that change intervals should be limited to a maximum of 3 months or 3000 miles, but that is something of a misnomer. Actually, most manufacturers recommend oil change intervals of 7500 miles or once a year under normal conditions. And in Europe, it's not uncommon to see oil changes exceeding 10,000 miles."
