Russell & Ruth Whitfeldt write:

We met 60 years ago when we both attended the same Junior High School in Tacoma, Washington. We were friends and even walked down the aisle together when we graduated from Lincoln High School in a class of 600. After graduation, our lives took different routes. Russ joined the Navy, married, and after discharge, served 5 years as an apprentice to become a journeyman plumber. At the same time, Ruth got her associates degree from a Junior College then transferred to the University of Washington to major in education to become a physical education teacher. Once I saw the word kinesiology, I quickly changed my mind! (What in the heck is kinesiology? I didn't know and I wasn't willing to find out!) I had always dreamed of becoming a "Stewardess" so after Fall Quarter of my Junior year of college, I decided to apply to fulfill that dream and applied to become a "Stewardess." Yup, that's what I hired on as in 1968. (Once the antidiscrimination laws took affect and men were allowed to apply for the "Stewardess" position, the name was changed to the generic moniker, Flight Attendant.) I was based in Chicago because I wanted to live somewhere different. What was I thinking? I 'died' from the heat in the Summer and froze my little 'ass' off in the winter. After 1-1/2 years of 'torture', I transferred back to Seattle where I married and had 2 children. Russ worked for the City of Tacoma in Washington State, in the Waste Water Treatment Center. We both were in the process of divorce when I went to a girls' Class of '66 luncheon. (We called them our double wine parties. Wine and Whine.) Well...I had a little too much wine and I whined about my failed marriage. Russ ran into one of our friends and she told him that I was divorcing. He phoned me and the rest is history...

Russell and I married in July of 1995. We have a blended family of a son from Russ's previous marriage and a son and a daughter from my previous marriage. Between us we have 3 granddaughters, 18, 10 and 7 years old and a 4-year-old grandson. Shortly after we married, we purchased a 1972 VW Bug. Russ fixed it up and we drove it everywhere. When we first purchased our Bug, we weren't able to take it to GoodGuys in Puyallup as it was too new. We started looking for an older car and found one on the internet in Denver, or so we thought. I worked the flight back to San Francisco while Russ slept (!), went through customs, flew back up to Seattle, slept, and then Russ went to work Monday morning. Co-workers asked him what he did over the weekend and Russ said, "I flew to Germany for dinner!" Truth!

We've driven all over the Western US and ventured driving to Missouri through to Tennessee down to Florida to visit friends, then back through Texas to Arizona. That was a fun one-month adventure. Next time we want to fly to New England and rent a car to venture through that part of the country. We're always up for cruising so any time you want to go, let us know. We've been on 4. We love that lifestyle. We dropped everything in October when some friends asked us to go to Cabo for a week. It was 2 weeks before they were to leave...yup...off we went...love it down there. We also crewed our own rented canal boat in France in 2000. We went with some of our friends from Australia who were competing in a seniors Rugby tournament. We rented 5 boats with friends from Australia, New Zealand, Canada, France, Poland, England and Scotland. What a party we had cruising through the canals in France. On our vessel, Russ captained and my friend and I were the 'mates' that tied up the boats when we went through the locks. It was a blast, one of my fondest memories.

Well...that about says it all. You never should have let me write this. I could go on and on as you can plainly see. Russ and I are happy that we have met each and every one of you. Thank you for letting us join Over the Hill Gang-Phoenix. Looking forward to many more 'adventures' with you!
