Hi Gang,

Guess it is our turn to share a little history on ourselves. Danise and I are both from Bellflower California, and graduated from Bellflower High School. We did not know each other in high school, as she was (still is) a couple of years younger than me. We met at the gas station I worked at in 1966, if I remember correctly. Current project is a 63 Falcon 2 door wagon. Something to keep me out in the garage. Danise likes that.

Joined the club in 2013, sponsored by Paul and Judy. Been a great time. Was President for 4 years and especially enjoy trips with OTHG friends. Oh yea, can't forget those 6 great grandkids.

Our oldest is getting married in April. Great grandkids to come?
