So last month Sharon Murray won the 50/50 and Phil sent me this road trip story for the newsletter....Thanks Phil and Sharon

So, here is a story about a road trip, in a street rod, of course.

I wanted to do a cross-country trip with my wife, attending as many car shows as timing would allow. I don't know if you have noticed, but in order to attend the maximum number of shows, you have to cris cross the country five or six times. We were not as ambitious as that, so chose to see the ones we could reasonable map out.

Starting from Surprise, we wanted to enjoy the trip and not kill ourselves getting from one place to another, so we rolled through Arizona heading east.

Our first goal was Back to the '50's in Minneapolis. On the way we enjoyed seeing the Bailey train yard, North Platt, NB, which is on route 66. Since there are several interesting spots in Nebraska, we stopped at the Archway on Hwy 35. It is a building that spans from one side to the highway to the other. Inside is a depiction of the settlers crossing from east to west. The upper floor is old, covered wagon style, where the lower floor is the 40's and 50's. Quite a neat place to spend a couple of hours and rest your back end.

We successfully rolled into the twin cities and faced 12,000 cars to experience. Wow! What a great show, 3 days of constant variety and quality. One of the unique and best parts of Back to the 50's is no judging. Everyone enjoys each other with no competition. Of course, there are the trailer queens, but we had more fun chatting with fellow rodders who either built their rigs or improved them. We had great weather and walked our legs off. Hard to pick a favorite, just so many wonderful expressions of style and color.

After the show, we visited the Mall of America in St. Paul, a giant indoor fun zone, water park, shopping mall, restaurants, etc. The thing that caught my eye was the large roller coaster. Hard to imagine all of this under a roof.

Next, we took in the Goodguys show in Des Moines. Another decent size car event with an overhead gondola, which took you from one end of the show to the other, saving many steps. We were blessed with a flat tire in the hotel parking lot. Easy fix with a tire shop nearby. Took trophy for long distance here.

Then on to friends place in Detroit for some downtime relaxation. After catching up with a college buddy, we traveled on to Columbus for another Goodguys show. Both these events are as large as Scottsdale or bigger. Saw a nice '53 Chevy pickup that looked exactly like the one Terry Porter has here in Surprise.

Our hotrod then took us down to Tennessee to visit more friends who used to live next door. Saw the Parthenon in Memphis, looks just like the one in Greece, only not damaged by time.

Starting to get home sick, so sped through Austin, stopped a day in San Antonio for the river walk. By this time, we had enough traveling, so we headed home to Surprise.

Six thousand miles, 20 states, 31 days and when we rolled into the driveway, we were still married. And you do not believe in miracles!

Great trip, don't have the stamina to do it again.
