Welcome to our newer club members. We are glad you chose to join us. Here's a little history and Info for you.

Way back in 1997 some of us went over to San Diego (San Diego and San Bernardino were founding chapters, each claiming to be the original - LOL) and inquired about starting a chapter, we promised to keep the club logo and colors, and we adopted the San Diego bylaws to get us started.

Over The Hill Gang has chapters all over the USA and a few overseas. In Arizona we have chapters in Havasu, Sierra Vista, and Tucson. So far plans to have a statewide chapter meet-up haven't worked out.

The club name has nothing to do with anyone's age. Story is it was adapted from the movie, and the fact that SD and San Bernardino had to go over the hill to hang out with each other.

OTHG is deep with Hot Rod traditions; as an example, San Diego chapter just had their **50**th "Streak" their signature car show/party event at Mission Beach CA,

the show is a big deal and OTHG takes over about 90% of the campgrounds (Camp land on the Bay)...

The chapters were originally a pre-1949 modified Hot Rod/Street rod Only. Over the last several years that has been modified by most all chapters to bring things more current.

(Not everyone agrees with that however.)

So... yellow/brown are the club colors...Shirts, jackets, hats, plaques and window stickers are available from the storekeeper. Club shirts are yellow; tee's or polos, long sleeve or short sleeve, with original OTHG logo front and back. Not everyone is in love with the yellow shirts, But we have committed to the founding chapter to hold with the tradition. We are allowed to do Anniversary shirts/jackets in other colors, that usually ends up being black. The black shirts and other colors are ok for travel, and social wear, but for club meetings, car shows and events YELLOW club shirts are preferred.

(We have approved the ladies brown shirts as well)

It's OK, and encouraged that we wear club shirts at any and all shows/car events attended. The show/event does not have to be organized by OTHG.

It's important that when wearing club attire that we are on our best behavior, our actions reflect on the entire club and organization.

There are some chapters who have modified the logos and colors, but as stated, the Phoenix Chapter has promised to retain the original colors and logo. The logo depicts 2 cars owned by founding OTHG members. More interesting history details are available on the San Diego OTHG website.

Travels - Best way to get to know other members is to join one of our cruises to a show; in town, out of town, sometimes out of state. Our Putts, (shorter runs for Breakfast or lunch) are also a good way to meet others. Past OTHG road trips have included; San Diego, Del Mar, Pomona, Bakersfield, Pleasanton CA, Gunnison Co, Logan Utah, Silver city NM, Williams, Globe, Payson, Winslow, Show Low, Pinetop, Tucson, Yuma and other AZ cities. Even Louisville KY and Des Moines Iowa. We have established some special routes to some place such as San Diego/Del Mar via Mecca and Julian CA.. More drive time and scenic/photo ops.

Most "putts" are to local restaurants for breakfast or lunch.

Get involved – Its getting difficult to get members involved and in becoming an officer or board member, but please consider the involvement, the success of the club depends on membership involvement.

The board of directors meets monthly to address issues, plan events, establish budget, and organize any special events like our Christmas Party or a fund raiser.
